Nature in Mikata Five Lakes

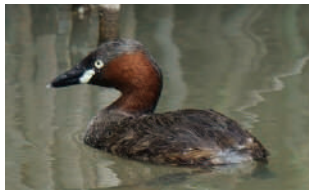
Wetland registered as a Ramsar Convention site

The varves of Lake Suigetsu are 70,000 years old and 45m long. They have been collected in a perfect condition without missing even a single year and are now recognized as the world standard "measure" for identifying past ages.



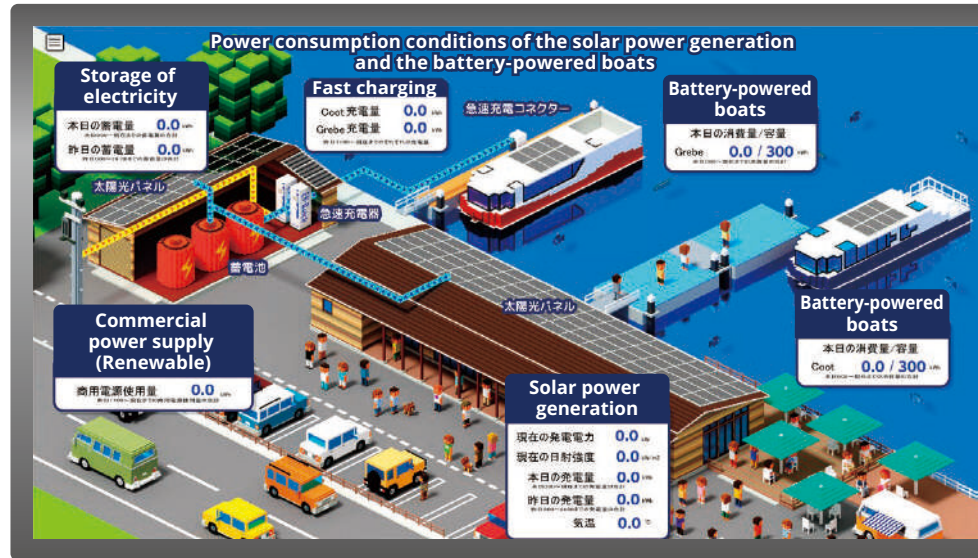

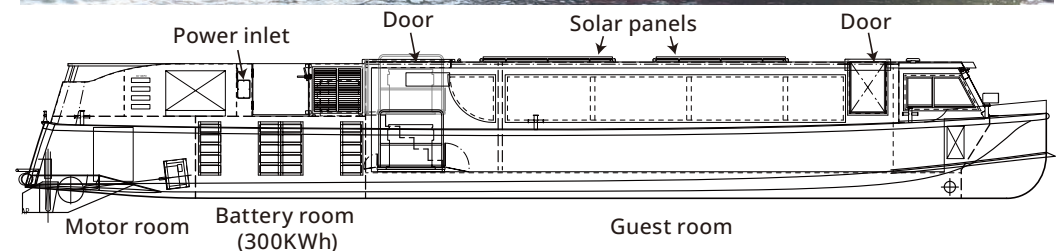


Boat No. 2 "Grebe"
