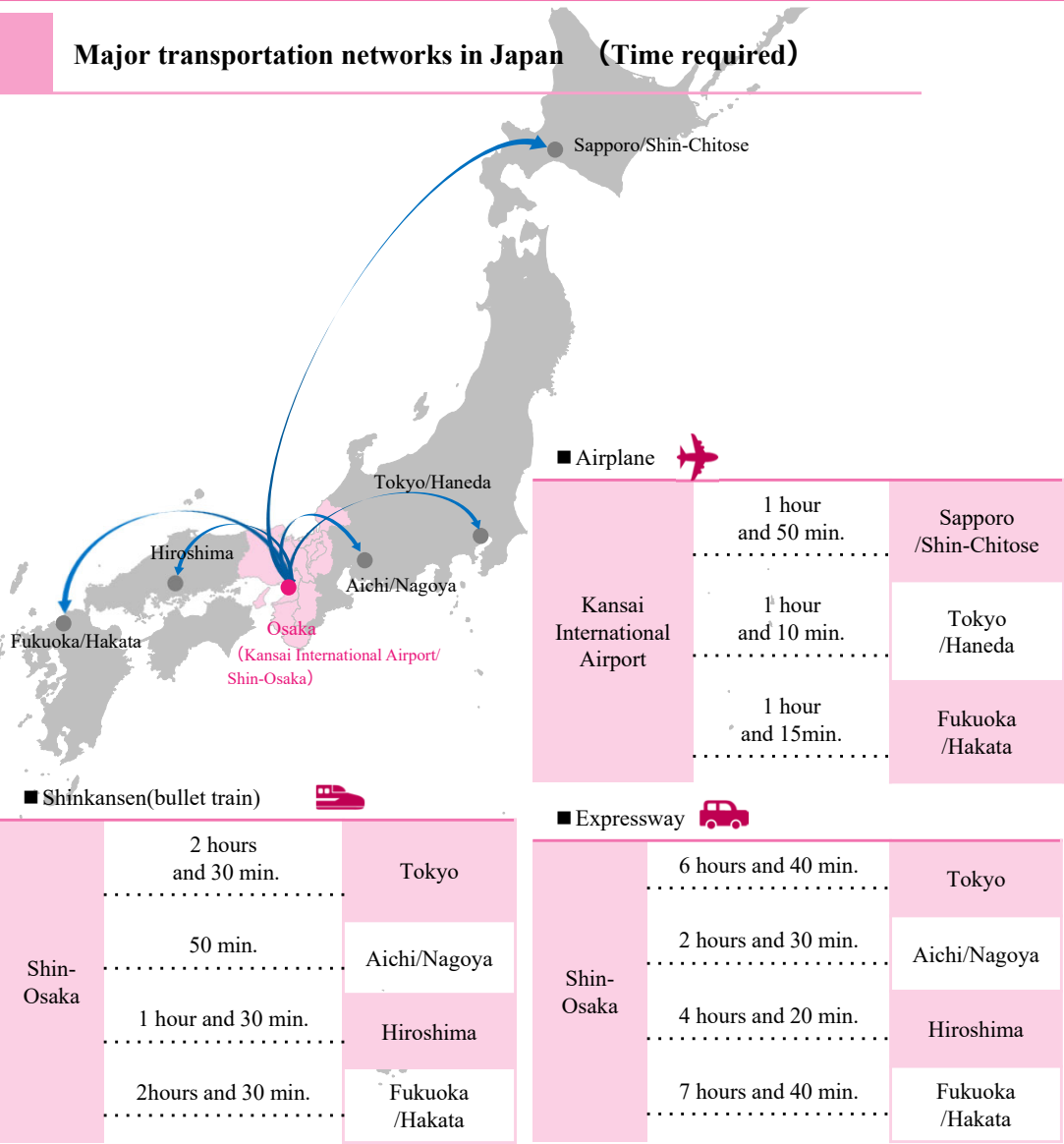


1 Location of the Kansai region and Highly Developed Infrastructure

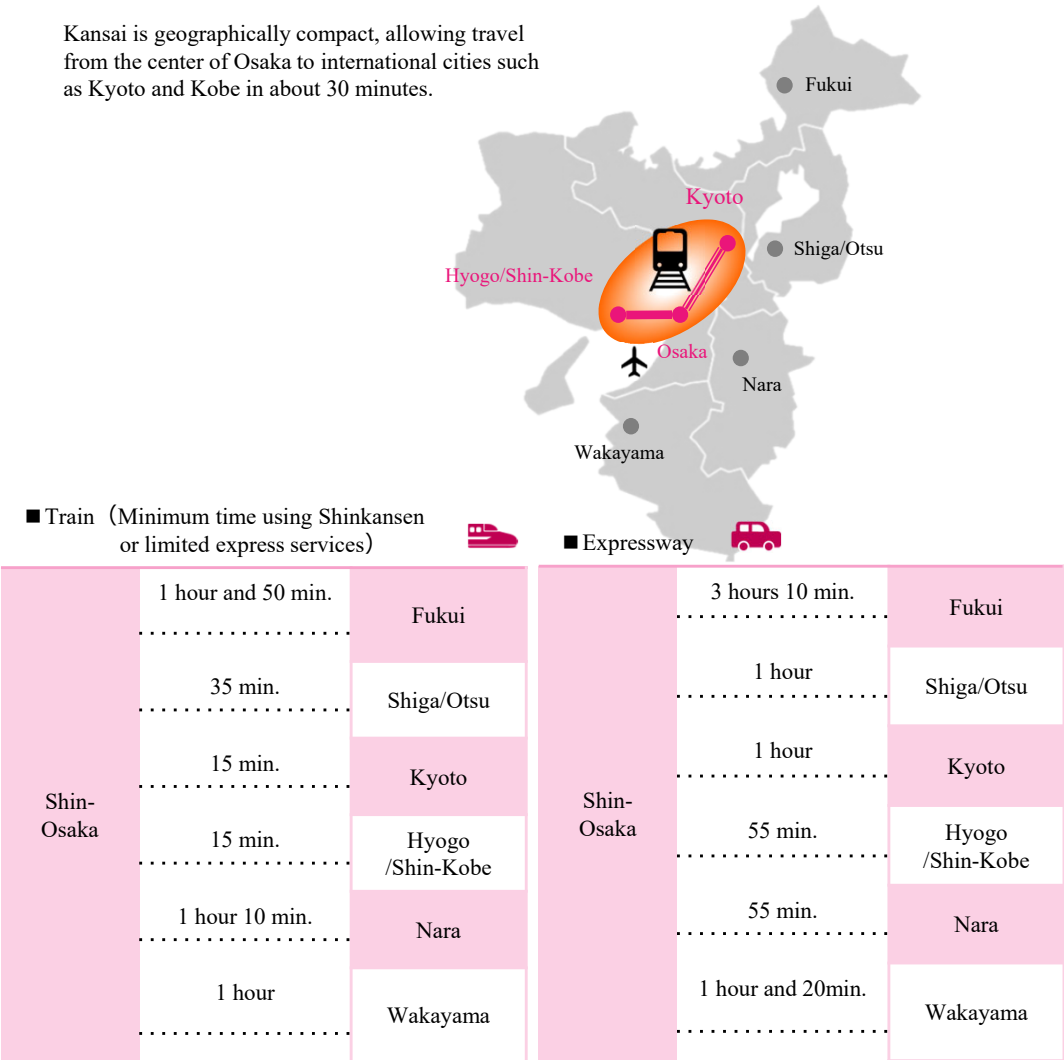
1-1 Location of the Kansai region and transportation infrastructure

- Kansai is located almost in the center of Japan and boasts a well-developed transportation network, including air, rail, and road systems.
- In particular, Kyoto, Osaka, and Kobe are adjacent to each other, with travel between them taking approximately 30 minutes.

1-2 Kansai is connected to the world/Asia by many routes

- Kansai International Airport is located in the center of Kansai, Japan, and operates 24 hours a day as an international cargo hub. It is connecting Asia and the rest of the world.
- In 2024, the number of flights in service per week reached 1,547.5. KIX operates 1,353 international passenger flights per week, 588 of which are low-cost carrier (LCC) flights, accounting for 43% of the total.
- In 2024, KIX provides direct access to 43 cities in Asia, and has 21 international LCCs connecting it to 27 additional cities, the largest network access among all the other domestic airports.
- Kansai plays a core role in Asia, with airports and seaports able to handle large volumes of cargo as an international trade hub.

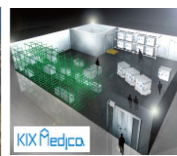

✈ 24-hour airport, Japan's first joint fixed-temperature storage for medicines

- The first in Japan to be able to pack and store pharmaceuticals at a constant temperature for export, realizing cool chain transportation of pharmaceuticals!

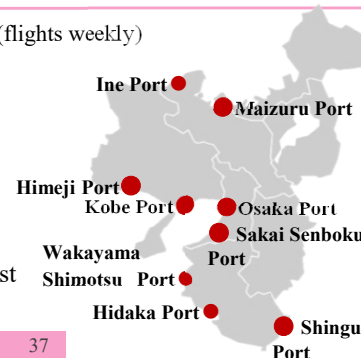
Notably, Kobe Port has the highest number of shipping routes to Southeast Asia in Japan.
